Report on Farmers Training conducted at Alagappa Nagar on 19-12-09

Introduction

Alagappa Nagar is a typical rural village in Kodakara Block of Thrissur District. Its agrarian economy is characterized by the predominance of small and marginal farmers, who depend on crops like paddy, coconut, banana, arecanut, pepper and other tree spices. Though the crops are cultivated by most farmers in the conventional manner, there is a sizeable number of progressive farmers due to the proximity of the Kerala Agricultural University and the presence of a strong coconut cluster promoted by the Coconut Development Board, Government of India. However, no on farm processing of commodities or value addition worth mentioning takes place in the area, leaving the farmers at the mercy of the village traders for the disposal of commodities. It was against this background that the Agricultural Market Intelligence Centre (NAIP) of Kerala Agricultural University, attached to the Department of Agricultural Economics, College of Horticulture organized a training programme on changing scenario of agricultural marketing in the State with a special reference to the price behaviour of pepper, cardamom and coconut on 19-12-09 at Alagappa Nagar in Trichur District. The venue of the training programme was Manjaly's Auditorium at Vendoor at Alagappa Nagar.
