Congratulations Team ANGRAU



First price forecast: ANGRAU advised to dispose the available stocks of Red Chillies before January 2010, otherwise they can store up to July 2010 to get better price.

Hats off Team Gujarat



Team Gujarat forecasted the prices of groundnut pods for November 2009 to February 2010. They forecasted

that price will remain in the range of Rs. 560 to 620 per 20 kg. The storage of Groundnut will not be remunerative. Hence, farmers are suggested to sale their groundnut accordingly.

Well-done Team Bangalore



University of Agricultural Sciences, Bangalore collected data on maize prices for the last nine years and the results revealed that the prices from November 2009 to January 2010 will hover around Rs.760-800 per quintal in markets like Davangere. Since storage does not increase the prices over the next two months, farmers are recommended to sell the harvested maize for the ruling price. Forecast yet to be released to press.

Congratulations team Kerala

Team Kerala successfully conducted their first farmers training programme. We learnt that the response from the farmers was encouraging with validation of pepper forecast nearly 100 per cent. Team Kerala now ready to forecast for coconut and copra in the coming months from November to December

before large scale arrivals are expected to reach the market from Tamil Nadu and Karnataka.

1. Price forecast

a).Karthigai pattam forecast

NAIP-DEMIC analysed prices of Karthigaipattam crops of chana, coriander and pearl millet. The cell forcasted the price of chana during Feb-March,2010 will be Rs.2300-2600 per quintal, coriander seed during February – April, 2010 would be in the range of Rs 4200 per quintal and the price of pearl millet will be between Rs 710 and 750.

b). Chillies price forecast

Chillies price forecast released on 22 October, 2009 -Export demand likely to sustain chilli prices

This forecast was published in news papers like Dinamalar, Daily Thanthi, Dinakaran, The Hindu, New Indian Express and in websites. The copies of the forecast were also sent to Joint Director of Agriculture, Deputy Director (Marketing), Market Committees and emailed to all Research Stations and KVKs.


4) Participation in the Farmers day Exhibition
